The Utah Academic Library Consortium's (UALC) record of accomplishment includes the first data network connecting all higher education institutions, the deployment of integrated library systems in all member libraries, and initiating Pioneer: Utah's Online Library. UALC has brought together the libraries in the State of Utah's higher education community – 2 Year, 4 Year, Master's-granting Universities, Research Universities, Public and Private – to create, provide, and preserve the essential knowledge base for higher education.

One-Time Funding Request:

The Mountain West Digital Library (www.mwdl.org) is an extensive compilation of newspapers, research articles, manuscripts, photographs, theses and dissertations, and audio, video and sound files. The Utah Digital Newspapers Program, which includes historical newspapers from nearly every county in Utah, is an ongoing project largely financed to date by grants. These newspapers are searchable word by word with access available from any internet connection. They preserve Utah's heritage by providing a rich source of historical and genealogical research.

UALC is seeking state assistance to continue the work of digitizing Utah's newspapers and making them readily available through the MWDL.
